### **Biographies**

Rachelle Berthelsen-Davis, violinist, is a professor of music on the faculty of Pacific Union College and the director of the Pacific Union College Orchestra and Vox Pro Musica. As soloist, concertmaster and chamber musician, Davis has toured Europe, the Middle East, South Africa, China, and Southeast Asia—as well as the United States, Canada, Mexico, and the Caribbean. She was an assistant professor of music at Columbia Union College and the concertmaster and assistant director for the New England Symphonic Ensemble, the resident orchestra for Mid-America Productions at Carnegie Hall, New York City. When she is not playing classical music, Davis loves improvisation and jamming with other styles of music.

Adrian Casanova is a multi-instrumentalist, singer-songwriter based in Ukiah. He graduated with the Prep Diploma at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. He has performed and collaborated alongside many local musicians. His EP album "You & Me" can be found on all streaming platforms. You can find him on social media (@adriancasa.nova)

Joel Cohen, cello, has spent his life pursuing many forms of musical expression through the cello. While steeped in the classical traditions of western music, he loves exploring other avenues of performance with his instrument. He was co-principal cello of the Oakland Symphony. While living in Vienna from 1985-97, Joel toured Europe, Asia, and the Americas as principal cellist of the Vienna Chamber Orchestra. Ten years in Boston had him playing with Boston Symphony, Portland Symphony, and PORT Summer opera. As the founding cellist with Quartet San Francisco Joel toured extensively in the US, during which the quartet was nominated twice for Grammy™ awards.

**Gwyneth Davis**, cellist, received her degree in music from Stanford University and also studied at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. She plays with the Lamplighters, Cinnabar Opera and many chamber music and baroque ensembles, and has performed with most of the regional orchestras in the Bay Area as well as with the Utah Symphony and San Francisco Opera.

**Sydney Christine Emerson** Originially from Ukiah, Sydney is an artist and web designer who walks the line between creative thinking and technical know-how. She studied architecture at UC Berkeley and now works as a product and web designer. You can find her at: uxfol.io/sydneychristine30.

Beth Heid, violist, has performed with many chamber ensembles and orchestras in the Bay Area. She has enjoyed international musical experience, playing with the Mexico City Philharmonic for several years, as well as spending several summers in Graz, Austria with a festival orchestra. She has been a member of the Napa Valley Symphony and also plays frequently with the Santa Rosa Symphony. Her academic experience includes a music degree from the Conservatory of Music at the University of the Pacific. She also studied chamber music at the Mozarteum in Salzburg, Austria with Jean Fournier and with noted Bay Area violist and teacher Robert Slaughter. Michele Rivard, mezzo-soprano, was the vocal coach and a performer in 20 productions for the professional musical theatre company, *Cabrillo Stage*. She has appeared with the Santa Cruz Symphony, Cabrillo Music Festival, New Music Works, Ensemble Monterey, Trinity Chamber Orchestra, Novato Lyric Opera, Woodminster Summer Theater, San Francisco Simphonietta, Distinguished Artists Concert & Lecture Series, Cabaret Santa Cruz, Picasso Ensemble, and the University of California Santa Cruz and Cabrillo College Orchestras. Michele retired as Music Program Chair from Cabrillo College in Aptos, after twenty-five years. She currently teaches Classical and Musical Theater students at Santa Clara University and at Solano College in Fairfield.

La Tania is recognized worldwide as a dancer, choreographer and master teacher. She has received rave reviews from Japan, to Spain and all over the United States and has won numerous awards for her productions. She continues to create and most recently received the Isadora Duncan awards for Outstanding Achievement for her work "Solaz".

Paloma Victoria Paloma Victoria Rodriguez Irizarry, originally from Puerto Rico, is a dedicated dancer, educator, and choreographer with a diverse background in dance and education. Her academic journey began at the Inter-American University of Puerto Rico, and continued at the University of Puerto Rico, Rio Piedras Campus, for a Master's Degree in Language. Her dance training was at Conservatorio Ballet Concierto under the tutelage of Carlota Carrera, María Carrera, Lolita San Miguel and José Pares. Paloma's performance experience spans theaters and festivals across California and Puerto Rico. In addition to performing, Paloma has showcased her talent as a choreographer. Her creative works include pieces like "Inner World" (2018) and "Through the Surface" (2023), highlighting her ability to synchronize movement with music and captivate audiences.

### Composers

**Maria Matilde Alea Fernández** (1918-2006) was a Cuban composer and teacher. Alea began her musical studies in Pinar del Río, Cuba. She later attended the Orbón Conservatory in Havana. Her compositions include works for piano, such as the Miniaturas rítmicas Cubanas of 1978.

**Andres Alén** (1950-) One of the most talented pianists to come out of Cuba in the second half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. He is a composer, arranger and educator. His compositions move between a number of different spheres, including classical, jazz and Cuban and Latin-American popular music.

**Maria Emma Botet** (1903-1989) Pianist, composer and educator. She studied with Hubert de Blanck and Joaquin Nin. She composed choral and piano works and pieces for voice and piano using a variety of idioms. Her musical language contains simplicity in the melodic and harmonic structure and translates with vigor the rhythm characteristic of Cuban music.

**Pedro Silvano Boudet**. (1828-1863) Violinist and composer. Organist in the Cathedral of Santiago de Cuba who inherited the role of choirmaster from Cratillo Guerra. He later became conductor of the Cathedral Orchestra as well. Boudet was a notable violinist who won awards at the Paris Conservatory. He also composed various works, including a mass for voice and orchestra as well as pieces for violin and piano.

**Ignacio Cervantes** (1847-1905) was the leading Cuban composer of the nineteenth century. His output was varied and included orchestral and stage works, but h is best known for his piano music, particularly for his Spanish-flavored Danzas Cubanas.

**Greg Danner** (1958- ) American composer, educator and professional musician. He has won many competitions and is a three-time winner of the Composers Guild. He is known primarily as a composer of music for wind bands, but has composed for choirs and various chamber ensembles. He has received annual ASCAP awards for composition since 1989 and is currently composer-in-residence and professor and Tennessee Tech.

Yalil Guerra (1973- ) classical guitarist, producer, composer, arranger, professor and conductor living in Los Angeles. He graduated from the National School of Music (E.N.A.) in Havana, Cuba with a Bachelor in Music. Master degrees from the Conservatorio Superior de Música de Madrid, Spain and from Shepherd University in Los Angeles and a Doctor of Philosophy in Music from the University of California, Los Angeles. His composition "Seducción" won best classical contemporary composition in the Latin Grammy Awards in 2012.

**Ernesto Lecuona** (1895-1963) is arguably the most important Latin musical figure of the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. He wrote hundreds of works during the era including popular standards as well as operettas, zarzuelas, ballets, and an opera. He studied with Maurice Ravel in Paris and after his debut in New York became a concert sensation. He left a legacy of music that crossed musical boundaries. **René Touzet** (1916-2003) Cuban composer, pianist and bandleader. He worked with Desi Arnaz, Xavier Cugat and Stan Kenton. He was a popular bandleader through the 1960s. Touzet retired in

Xavier Cugat and Stan Kenton. He was a popular bandleader through the 1960s. Touzet retired in 1972 and devoted his remaining years to composing for the piano. Touzet was given several honors and awards for his musical contributions and in 2001 the mayor of Miami declared September 9 as "René Touzet Day".

**José White** (1835-1918) Cuban violinist, composer and educator. He performed globally and in 1875, performed twice with the New York Philharmonic Orchestra becoming the first soloist of African

descent. He was a friend of pianist and composer Ignacio Cervantes and a supporter of the Cuban Liberation Army which caused them both to be exiled.
